In partnership with Tate & Lyle, Vital Pathways will be awarding Community Mini-Grants with a maximum award of up to \$1000 each. Vital Pathways is a 501 (C)3 organization whose purpose is to improve quality of life in our local communities and Tate & Lyle is a world leader in ingredient solutions for healthier food and beverages.

## Grant Eligible

- Municipal governments, 501 (C)3 organizations, and non-profit organizations within the following towns are eligible to apply: Amity, Cary Plantation, Hammond Plantation, Hodgdon, Houlton, Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians, Linneus, Ludlow, Monticello, Littleton, Orient, Haynesville, and New Limerick.
- Any teacher, counselor, or administrator working in a K-12 public school connected to Region 2: School of Applied Technology (RSU 29, MSAD 70, RSU 50, RSU 84/MSAD 14, & RSU 89).

## Grant Criteria

Mini-Grant applications must promote the interest of your community and will be judged on the following criteria:

- Projects must address a need in the community that promotes education in STEAM, Health, or Nutrition.
- Great consideration will be given to the quality and completeness of applications.

## Additional Information

- Grants are issued as reimbursements. Requests for upfront payments will be taken into consideration.
- Applicants must be compliant with all local, state, and federal regulations associated with the project.
- All funded projects must provide a written report describing the results of the completed project. If possible, provide pictures.
